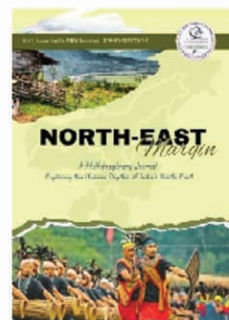


Growth of English Literature Contributed by Assamese Writer - A Random Study

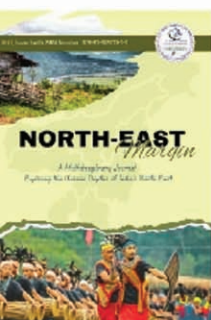

3. Methodology

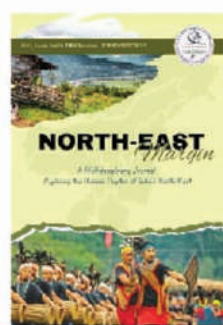

9. Limitations:

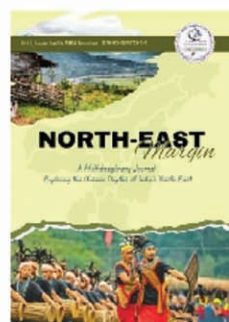

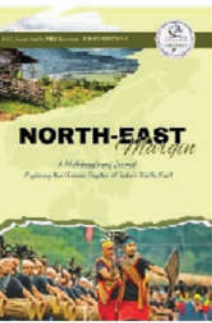
